Job Title: Lifeguard

Position Overview

To further the mission of the camp by ensuring a safe environment at the camp's waterfront activities. Assist in the management to the physical operation of the waterfront facilities and equipment.

Essential Job Functions

- Assist in swimming and water activity programs
- Guard waterfront activities
- Provide rescues as needed
- Ensure the camp staff and campers are aware and follow safety procedures at all water areas
- Provides surveillance of water activities to help prevent injuries
- Direct and supervise camper behavior to ensure they stay in compliance of water safety rules
- Monitor all water activities to and report all issues, hazards, or concerns to Camp Director
- Evaluate aquatics abilities of campers and staff
- Ensure campers and staff follow safety procedures while in their program activity.
- Act as reference in waterfront activities.
- Assist in the delivery of all water activities and special events at the waterfront.
- Assist in the management and care of the physical facilities and equipment in the waterfront program area
- Conduct daily check of area and equipment for safety, cleanliness, and good repair.
- Maintain the cleanliness of the waterfront area daily keeping it free of hazards and debris.
- Participate enthusiastically in all camp activities, planning and leading those as assigned.
- Participate as a member of the camp staff team to deliver and supervise evening programs, special events, overnights, and other all-camp activities and camp functions.
- Assist in the planning of any special events on or near the waterfront.

Requirements

- Current American Red Cross Lifeguard or equivalent required; certification in as a Waterfront Lifeguard, Head Lifeguard and Water Safety Instructor desirable.
- One-year experience working as a lifeguard preferred, OR any equivalent combination of training and experience which provides the required knowledge, skills and abilities.
- Desire and ability to work with children outdoors in the water.

Physical Demands

- Prolonged standing, some bending, stooping, and stretching.
- Eye-hand coordination and manual dexterity to manipulate waterfront equipment and waterfront activities.
- Normal range of hearing and eyesight to record, prepare, and communicate appropriate camper activities/programs and the
- Ability to lift up to 50 lbs.
- Willingness to live in a camp setting and work irregular hours delivering program in the facility available.
- Operate with daily exposure to the sun and heat and varying water conditions.
